VENUE

The Main Lecture Theatre is on the ground floor of Bangor University's School of Electronic Engineering Building (this building may also be referred to as 'Informatics'), which is located on Dean Street in Bangor LL57 1UT. The Lecture room is accessible via the main entrance and then follow the directional signs on display.

CAR PARKING

The car park barrier to the University Dean Street Car Park should be open on the day. If there is a problem there is an intercom system which links to Reception / Security staff who will be able to raise the barrier for you.

Coming from Garth Road onto Dean Street, the entrance to the Car park is the second access road (unmarked – enters into University premises) on the left opposite the new NCP car park.

Please ensure you park within designated car parking spaces and display your Permit. The Car Parking Permit is printed at the bottom of this Flyer and must be displayed in the front windscreen. The University operates strict *Parking Regulations* and your vehicle may be towed-away immediately if blocking access or pedestrian routes or otherwise causing a health and safety hazard. Vehicles parked without a valid Permit may be immobilized and a cost is associated with its release.
