- 1 in 10,000
- 1 in 100,000
- 1 in 1,000,000




So why do people.....?

- Never thank H&S for making their world safer?




UK accident data








Govt Resources on Safety - £m


→ HASS/LASS stopped in 2001/2

- No feedback loop






Cost to Society of a fatality





Three Point Plan for Public Health

- Direction to DsPH (via Public Health England) to develop a Local Accident Prevention Plan (LAPP).
- Appointment of a LAPP coordinator to manage data and the feedback loop to deliver savings to the NHS.
- LAPP to include:
 - Programmes of intervention based on local data e.g. Young children, the elderly.
 - Partnership-based working including the use of volunteers.
 - Measurement of impact at local A&E/GP levels.
