***THE SPEAKER***

Philip is an Associate in the Regulatory Team of the Litigation and Dispute Management Group for Eversheds.

He specialises in corporate criminal defence work and has experience in Health and Safety (in particular, work related fatalities), Environmental, Deaths in Custody, Product Liability and Road Traffic.

He has been involved in the accident investigation process and has assisted with the management of post-incident actions following workplace fatalities on numerous occasions. He has also experienced the prosecution process, including dealings with the HSE and Police and attendance at Magistrates' Court and Crown Court.

Philip has been involved in several health and safety cases, including deaths following falls from height, vehicle collisions and workplace machinery accidents. He also has extensive experience of attending Coroner's Inquests.

Philip has delivered presentations to a variety of audiences, on numerous topics, including the Corporate Manslaughter and Corporate Homicide Act 2007, Health and

Safety offences and accident investigations.

**THE TALK**

The Talk will focus on providing a 'legal update' on what is current and ongoing with respect to the law.

### **CAR PARKING**

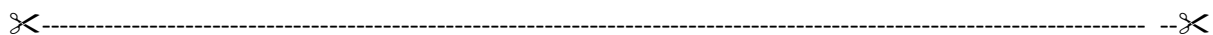

Coming from Holyhead Road onto College Road, the entrance to the car parks are clearly visible.
