“Practical Accident Investigation Workshop”

THE TALK

Accident investigation workshop involves groups of 3/4 people in teams investigating an incident where all the information is available, provided on request by your table leader acting out various roles, so long as the proper investigative procedures are followed.

The scene is set in a small Welsh Village where there has been a road traffic incident involving a road tanker.

The afternoon's objectives are to consider:

- The cause of the incidents and provide a detailed time schedule of events leading up to their initiation.
- What human factors took part in the incidents
- Whether prosecutions are expected and what these are likely to be.

The event is likely to last for 2 to 2.5 hours and will prove to be very interesting and informative for all who take part. It is suitable for those both experienced and completely inexperienced in accident investigation.

CAR PARKING

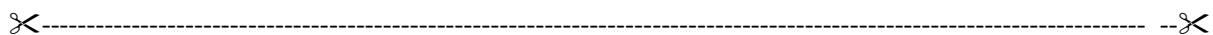
Please note that car parking at this area is limited and you may need to walk a short distance from parking so please allow time do so.
