# **The Regulatory Reform Order (Fire Safety)**

# **Dave Greene**

Fire Safety Inspecting Officer, North Wales Fire and Rescue Service

## THE SPEAKER

Dave has been employed by the North Wales Fire and Rescue Service (NWFRS) and the former Gwynedd Fire Service for 17 years. Prior to this, he worked as an electrical engineer.

The majority of his service has been operational as a Fire-fighter, Crew Manager and Watch Manager before becoming involved with legislative fire safety.

He currently works from the North Gwynedd Area office in Caernarfon as a Fire Safety Inspecting Officer sharing his working time approximately equally between carrying out inspections under the Regulatory Reform (Fire safety) Order 2005 including advising on how companies and individuals can comply with the legislation and on other matters such as Licensing, Housing consultations, Planning issues and supporting the County's Fire Stations initiatives and campaigns.

### THE TALK

The Regulatory Reform Order (Fire Safety)
2005 came into force on 1 October 2006, and
replaced over 70 separate pieces of fire safety
legislation. The purpose of the Fire Safety
Order (FSO) is to simplify fire safety legislation
and reduce the number of enforcing authorities
that businesses have to deal with. Under the
FSO a 'responsible person' (usually the owner,

employer or occupier of business or industrial premises) must carry out a fire risk assessment. Responsible persons under the Order are required, following a risk assessment, to implement appropriate fire safety measures to minimise the risk to life from fire; and to keep the assessment up to date.

Dave will provide an overview of:

- The role of the NWFRS who they are and what they do
- The origins and development of the FSO – what it means on a practical day to day basis
- What needs to be done to comply with the FSO
- What happens during an audit
- Examples of problems and best practice encountered during the audit findings
