## ‘Project ARGUS’

### Protecting Against Terrorist Attack

#### THE TALK / WORKSHOP

Project ARGUS is a National Counter Terrorism Security Office (NaCTSO) initiative, exploring ways to aid you in preventing, handling and recovering from a terrorist attack.

It achieves this by taking businesses through a simulated terrorist attack. The simulation identifies the measures to take for preventing, handling and recovering from a terrorist attack.

What you can expect?

Although none of us want, or would expect to be involved in a terrorist attack we may at some time be in an area that is targeted. This valuable session will not only show how such attacks can happen but also how people may react and behave to provide a better understanding for us all should the unthinkable ever happen.

Argus is a completely free event which takes you through a realistic terrorist attack using a multi-media simulation. A series of questions and challenges are put to you, both individually and as a group and will have to resolve them. You will work in small syndicate groups with other local business representatives. The whole event including a coffee break will last about 2.5 -3 hours.

It is also an excellent opportunity for yourself or others from your organisation to evaluate the training as it can also be provided free to other members of your staff on site by arrangement.

#### THE FACILITATORS

The workshop is being facilitated by members of the Wales Extremism and Counter Terrorism Unit (WECTU) in partnership with members of the North Wales Police, the North Wales Fire and Emergency Service, the Ambulance Service and representatives from Emergency planning within Local Authorities.

Together these individuals will also form part of the ‘expert panel ‘ that will be a part of the interactive workshop question sessions.

### **CAR PARKING**

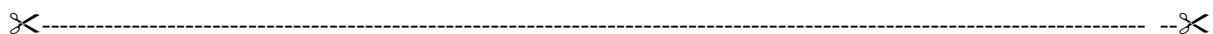

Coming from Holyhead Road onto College Road, the entrance to the car parks are clearly visible.

Please ensure you park within designated car parking spaces and display your Permit. The Car Parking Permit is printed at the bottom of this Flyer and must be displayed in the front windscreen.
